

Jack Andrews - Left sided central defender Andrews was a young professional at Nottingham Forest and counts Boston United, Eastwood, Quorn and Basford United among his former clubs.

Louis Anthony - Central defender Louis Anthony arrives at the club from Stone Old Alleynians. Louis has impressed in both of the club's friendly fixtures so far in pre-season and has looked a big, strong, physical presence. Louis has good experience at the level and is a very solid addition to the developing squad.

Nathan Banton - Defender now in his second season with the club signed from Kimberley MW.

Fin Barker - Barker has signed for the club following a brief spell at Rovers early last season on loan from Solihull Moors.
Despite a quite sensational debut performance at The Moat against Boldmere St Michaels, his loan spell was brought to a premature end by a nasty concussion suffered in the following game. Finn now links up with the club full time having moved away permanently from Solihull.

Alex Britton - Locally based player joins the club from divisional rivals Heanor Town, where he has been a mainstay in their side for the past few seasons. Britton, a former youth player at Burton Albion, had a brief loan spell with Gresley Rovers many years ago. His addition will bring valuable defensive stability and know-how to the club's young, attack-minded squad.

Eli Christie - Young defender recently signed from Grantham Town

Jenson Cooper - The striker

joins us from Shepshed Dynamo for a second spell at the club. He was part of last season's squad for the latter end. Other clubs include Belper United, Redditch United, AFC Rushden & Diamonds, Walsall Wood and Shrewsbury Academy.

Ethan Goodfellow - Young player who has come through the Youth and Reserve ranks.

Ste Hart - Forward Ste returned to Gresley in the summer. He is a big impact player and well known for a thunderous shot and accurate long passing.

Dylan Hunniford - Young youth team graduate Dylan is an exciting prospect who has made a notable impression. We are expecting further development from Dylan and believe he has a bright future at the club. Was voted supporters' player of the year 2023-2024.

Ryan King - Kingy might just be the most naturally gifted at the club but unfortunately for him, injuries and misfortune have not been kind to him. He still has a little while to get back to full fitness, but the prognosis looks good.

Alby Lansdowne – Another local lad who is popular with the Moat faithful returns to the club after a break

Kane Lee – A local lad who needs no introduction. Lee returns to the club after brief spells at Loughborough Dynamo and AFC Wulfrunians.

Jake Meakin - Young midfielder signed in close season.

Carl Abbott (Manager) Former central defender as a player who played in the Midland Alliance for Sandwell Borough, Halesowen Harriers and Alvechurch before moving into management at the age of 28 following serious injury. UEFA B coaching award holder who enjoyed a lengthy and hugely successful period as manager of Wolverhampton Casuals which saw him land the much sought-after Hinckley job. Another lengthy spell linking up with Paul Tomlinson yielded strong league campaigns, cup wins, and significant FA Cup and FA Vase runs, before a step up in levels with Market Drayton Town, Quorn, Evesham United and AFC Wulfrunians

Paul Tomlinson (Assistant Manager) Former professional player with Sheffield United who was once subject of a transfer approach from 'big' Jack Charlton when manager at Newcastle United. Played for Stafford Rangers and Halesowen Harriers before moving into management and coaching. Previously Assistant Manager at Alvechurch, Halesowen Town and Evesham United, before linking with a former player of his in Carl Abbott, and subsequently becoming his long-term number two through lengthy and hugely successful spells at Hinckley, Quorn, Market Drayton Town and a second spell with Evesham United

KIMBERLEY MINERS WELFARE HISTORY

Kimberley Miners Welfare Football Club was formed in 1926, one year after the opening of the Miners Welfare. Early years was spent playing at the Mill Field, approx 1/2 mile North of Digby Street. In 1932 KMWFC moved to the new recreation ground, Digby Street, situated adjacent to Digby Colliery and its cricket ground.Initially, Digby Street was solely a playing field with teams changing in Tommy Bird's (pronounced Tommy Bod's, in the local dialect) front room.

It was a lengthy walk, for players and officials to Digby Street, because Tommy lived in a house supplied for workers, on site, at the Giltbrook Leather Works. In

the late 1950s, changing facilities moved, to the Miners Welfare Bowling Alley underneath the building, which meant an even longer walk for players and officials! KMWFC have played at Digby Street for 81 years but, it hasn't been continuous.

The club played at the Wolsey Sports Ground for 1 season, 1974/75 (situated were Sainsbury's Car Park now is, in Kimberley Town Centre), because the construction of the new A610 Eastwood and Kimberley Bypass took away part of the ground and made it unusable. 1982 was a key year in the history of the club as the present chairman Neil Johnson took on the role of chairman from his father. It wasn't until the 1995/6 season that changing facilities were provided on the ground. A £7,500 grant from the National Lottery, and an equivalent generous donation from Chairman Neil Johnson, enabled the club to buy, transport and erect, the unwanted changing rooms from Calverton Cricket Club.

This was around he time of the clubs most successful period on the pitch under the leadership of Paul Horry Kimberley won all 4 trophies available to them. Paul Horry left and was replaced on a caretaker basis by Steve Hobster. Don Munn took charge before the appointment of George Hulley. The joint management of Alf Stacey and Steve Towle took charge in the early 2000s.

The pair resigned a few years later when Kimberley then turned back to the successful George Hulley who remained in charge until 2014, standing down following the clubs best season in a decade, finishing runners up in the Notts Senior League and gaining promotion to the East Midland Counties League, the highest level the football club have ever played at.

In 2014 KMW appointed Paul Rawden and Dino Labbate as the clubs new first team management. In the summer of 2015 the club made a number of changes of the pitch with Brian Franks and Malc Burton as well as the appointment of a New Secretary and Development Officer. In September 2015 Paul Rawden resigned his position and was quickly replaced by ex Ashby and Stapenhill Manager Tony Hemmings.

Despite a positive start results turned and club parted company with Hemmings. Club Captain Martin Lench was appointed as Manager along side the long serving Andy Miller until the end of the season.

The duo retained the clubs EMCL Status. In June 2016 Welfare announced the appointment of Ian Deakin as joint manager along side Martin Lench. Deaks joins the club was vast experience of non league football as the club look to reach the FA Cup for the first time in their history, developments to allow to the club and town to fulfil its potential.

The aim was met as Deakin stood down as manager. The club turned to the vastly experienced team of Andy Alls, Luke Humphreys and John Humphreys to lead the club in the 2017/18 season. In April 2018 Alls stepped down due to personal reasons and the club turned to Luke Humphreys with the support of John Humphreys and Tim Lee to see out the season. Humphreys was given the job on permanent basis and he brought in former Borrowash and Holbrook Manager Marko Markelic as joint manager ahead of the 2018/19 season.

The management team resigned at the end of the season to move to pastures new. In May 2019 the club appointed the team of Anthony Ward and Graham Furnell from Basford United to take charge of first team affairs. From the 2021/22 season the club have moved to the United Counties Football League. The 2021/22 saw the club become Champions of the United Counties League Division and as such gain promotion the United Counties Premier League, the highest level of football in the clubs 96 year history. The club also smashed our previous record attendance with a crowd of 742 against Nottingham Forest U23s in the Notts Senior Cup

NEWARK TOWN MATCH REPORT

This game had almost everything, eight goals, a disallowed goal for an offside which wasn't, the woodwork struck, and a penalty saved.

There was a good following from Gresley who would have been extremely happy with a point before the game but travelling home later it must have felt like a defeat as Rovers were a minute or so of taking all three points off another highflying side.

Rovers started well and were in front on 9 minutes. A cross to the far post eventually was cleared to Jamie Sleigh who hit a superb side volley which beat home keeper Jake West all hands down. It got even better 7 minutes later when Ryan King's quick break saw him lay the ball on for Kane Lee who took his chance well to beat West

On 29 minutes the home side were handed a lifeline as the referee awarded a very soft penalty. Alby Lansdowne was adjudged to have pushed a Newark player as he backed into the Rovers player at the near post awaiting a corner. To make things worse Lansdowne was sent to the sin bin for 10 minutes. However, justice was seen to be done as keeper Louie Turner saved the resulting penalty kick by Matty Clark.

Newark went close to reducing the deficit a couple of minutes later with Ryan Rushden heading over a simple chance from another corner.

Just before the break Newark did reduce their deficit when a long throw to the far post was headed home by Louis Czerwak. Four minutes later they were level when Rushden, left in acres of space, headed powerfully home from just inside the box.

The home side were celebrating clawing their way back into the game when Lee fought for the ball over in the right corner before sending over the perfect cross for Louis Anthony to head home. Newark looked shellshocked as the whistle ended the half.

Rovers made two changes for the start of the second half with Alex Britton replacing debutant Eli Christie and Jacob Sturgess, Jake Meakin.

Another chance for Rovers came on 49 minutes with Lee trying another of his long-range lobs which flew just over the bar with West well out of his goal. But Rovers didn't have to wait long to regain their two-

goal advantage again. Sleigh played an inch perfect through ball slicing the Newark defence in half for King to run onto and he cooly finished slipping the ball past the onrushing West.

Rovers should have extended their lead when Sleigh netted the ball from close in but the officials made a very dubious decision deciding he was offside even though a defender was standing on the goal line at the far post. Sleigh was devastated and very angry to have been denied a perfectly good goal which would have put his side three goals in front.

On 67 minutes Newark went close with an almighty scramble in the Rovers box but somehow the ball stayed out of the net. A minute later Rovers made another change with Jenson Cooper replacing King.

Rovers were having the better of the chances with Lee firing narrowly over from the left, Fin Barker hitting his shot straight at West and Sleigh volleying wide and then straight at the keeper.

Newark went close themselves with a shot blazed over when well-placed and Smith crashing the base of the post. On 89 minutes substitute Cooper was inches away from scoring denied by the toe of West's outstretched leg as the front man burst forward

For the final few minutes Rovers were having to repel a heavy onslaught on their goal but unfortunately for them their defence was breached on 90 minutes when Joe Braithwate managed to find the back of the net and just when Rovers thought they were home and hosed the home side scored an unlikely equaliser.

Instead of hitting the ball as far from their goal as possible Rovers were struggling to clear it and a cross was headed home in the fifth minute of added on time by Ryan Smith with his teammates and supporters celebrating like they'd just won the title so was their relief of snatching a point at the end.

Anyone witnessing this game as a neutral would have been hard pressed to have know which team was at the top end and which was at the bottom end of the table with nothing to separate them in the end.

Both managers would have left this game thinking they could or rather should have taken all three points but to be honest a draw was probably the right result in what was an entertaining game with both sides playing good fast moving football.



SANDIACRE TOWN MATCH REPORT

On a horribly wet evening at the Moat Ground, Gresley Rovers strolled into the next round of the Derbyshire Senior Cup.

Rovers started well with Jamie Sleigh having a blistering shot tipped over the bar by visiting keeper James Roffey followed by Alby Lansdowne putting his effort wide of the post.

More pressure from the home side saw Jenson Cooper put through on goal but was denied by the legs of the keeper. Finlay Barker was causing problems for the visitors, and he went close cutting in from the left before having a shot well saved by Roffey but their was no stopping Rovers seconds later when Barker made another fine run down the wing and put a low cross into the box which slipped home at the far post to give his side the lead.

On 54 minutes Sandiacre went close with Farbod Yousefi forcing a save at Turner's near post. Harrison Solomon was making run after run down the right and went close firing across the face of the goal.

A couple of minutes later the lights went out as an area power outage put everywhere in darkness. When the power resumed Rovers made several changes and they continued the pressure on Sandiacre and that pressure paid off as a result of another good run down the right and the ball played into the area for substitute Ethan Goodfellow to run onto before beating the keeper with his well struck shot.

Goal number four came from the penalty spot after Barker was upended in the area giving the referee no option but to point to the spot. The kick was taken by Sleigh who powered his shot straight down the middle giving Roffey.

Barker, who had caused the visiting defence problems, got a goal himself on 82 minutes making a blistering run from the left and ending the move with a well struck shot past Roffey.

With the game almost at an end the visitors had a couple of chances to decrease the deficit with Prestyn Moore's well stuck shot coming off the bar and a corner from the left to substitute Limar Carlin who back heeled a clever flick that just flew the wrong side of the far post.



MEET THE UCL

The United Counties League covers an area including the English counties of northern Bedfordshire, northern Buckinghamshire, most of Cambridgeshire, southern Derbyshire, southern Leicestershire, most of Lincolnshire, western Norfolk, Northamptonshire, southern Nottinghamshire, northern Oxfordshire, Rutland, eastern Staffordshire, eastern Warwickshire and eastern West Midlands.

It has a total of five divisions, three for first teams and two for reserve teams, but the reserves' divisions were merged into a single division for the 2013–14 season and remains so at present. Clubs in the Premier Divisions are eligible to enter the FA Cup in the preliminary round stages. The clubs in the league are eligible for the FA Vase, and there are knockout cups for the Premier/Division One clubs and for the Reserve Divisions clubs.

History


The United Counties League was formed in 1895 as the Northamptonshire Junior League, dropping the 'Junior' one year later. It took its current name in 1934 as teams from other counties had long since been a part of the league. Over the years the UCL has 'united' teams from Northamptonshire, Rutland and Bedfordshire with those from parts of Buckinghamshire, Cambridgeshire,

Huntingdonshire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire and even Norfolk.

Northampton Town joined the league in 1897 and became champions in their second season before moving up to the Southern League. They would become the league's first former member to reach the Football League in 1920. In 1900 Bedford Queens became the first club from outside the county to join the league. The Football Association announced on 12 April 2021 that United Counties League would administer a new Step 5 division since the 2021–22 season after the scheduled National League System restructure had a one-season postponement due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Step 5

The league has two divisions at level 9 (step 5) of the National League System (NLS). Member clubs take part in cup competitions organised by the county FA to which they are affiliated and other cup competitions. The north division has 20 clubs, feeding into the Northern Premier League Division One Midlands and East. The south division has 20 clubs, feeding into the Northern Premier League Division One Midlands and Southern Football League Division One Central.

We first played Heanor Town way back on 2nd November 1895 in the FA Cup (English Cup) 2nd Qualifying Round over 125 years ago! We lost the game 4-0.

The first league game was on 4th February1922 in the Central Alliance. This one we won 4-1 with goals from Warren, Baylis 2 and Kendall.

GRESLEY ROVERS HISTORY

Gresley Rovers were formed in 1882 in the small mining village of Church Gresley, which is near to Swadlincote - the biggest town in South Derbyshire.

Their first ground was at Mushroom Lane in Albert Village a mile or so from Church Gresley and they played mainly friendlies and cup games for ten years before joining the Burton Junior League for the 1892/93 season. They won their first league title in the 1894/95 season eleven points clear of their nearest rivals in the Burton Junior League.

Rovers moved from the quaintly named Mushroom Lane ground (which they shared with the local cricket club Mushroom Lane CC) to the newly acquired Church Street Ground in time for the 1895/96 season. They stayed at Church Street till near the end of the 1907/08 season when they had to move as the land was required for building and moved across the road onto the newly acquired Moat Ground - the ground they still play on today.

Six seasons from 1985/6 Gresley finish 4th, 4th, 2nd, 3rd, Ist and 1st. During that period they also won the Derbyshire Senior Cup on four successive occasions. Season 1990/91 was a particularly good one for Gresley. In addition to the League Title and the Derbyshire Senior Cup win they also reached the final of the F.A. Vase and so had the honour of playing at Wembley. Their opponents were Guiseley and some National Newspapers reported it as 'the most exciting Wembley Cup Final ever'. Unfortunately, they only drew before losing the replay.

Paul Futcher was appointed manager with Garry Birtles, former England International, his assistant on 2nd November 1995. The season 1996/7 was the best in the Club's long history because in addition to retaining the Derbyshire Senior Cup they also won the Dr. Martens Premier Division championship, Rovers were unbeaten in their first seventeen league games (won 10 drawn 7) and were league leaders for 31 weeks. The title was finally won with a 3 - 1 home victory against Gloucester City at the Moat Ground on April 26th 1997. Gresley Rovers became the first Derbyshire side and first village side to win this prestigious trophy, but ground grading meant that they were unable to gain promotion to the Football Conference

After financial difficulties, Gresley Rovers liquidated at the end of the 2008–09 season, forming a new football club, Gresley F.C.

Gresley FC

Gresley FC was formed in 2009 and enjoyed a very successful first season in the East Midlands Counties League. The side. managed by Gary Norton, finished as runners up and therefore narrowly missed out on promotion. Gresley also enjoyed a long run in the FA Vase by beating Spennymoor, Dawlish and Long Buckby. The Dawlish tie in particular will live long in the memory as the original tie was abandoned in extra time and the Moatmen won the replay in South Derbyshire on penalties. The Vase run came to an end in front of the home fans in disappointing fashion at home to Whitehawk in the quarter-finals.

2010-2011 Gresley's second season as a club and also their second in the East Midlands Counties League saw another good FA Vase run getting to the last 32 and then going one step further from the previous season by winning the league after an exciting run-in. Being a few points behind the leading contenders Gresley could not afford to slip up again after an unexpected home defeat in early January if their dreams were to be realised. An amazing 20 game unbeaten run with the final 8 all victories saw Gresley crowned as champions and promoted into the Midland Football Alliance.

Season 2011-2012 saw another good run in the FA Vase reaching the last 16 and to top off a superb season Gresley achieved a remarkable back-to-back title success as they lifted the Midland Football Alliance title at their first attempt and promotion to the Evo-Stik NPL Division One South.

The first season back at level four was successful as Gresley settled into the Division One South. Gresley finished just outside the top ten in the league and reached the 3rd Qualifying round of the FA Cup. At the end of the season joint manager Gary Norton stepped down with Martin Rowe named as manager.

GRESLEY ROVERS HISTORY CONTINUED

After losing their first two league fixtures of 2013-2014 and then an indifferent spell up to Christmas Gresley managed to stabilise their performances and ended the season in a creditable 9th place. However, in both the FA Cup and FA Trophy Gresley had good runs going out of the cup after forcing Conference South outfit Brackley Town to a replay after a good draw at St James Park in the 2nd Qualifying Round and in the Trophy they took Conference Premier side Wrexham almost all the way in the First Round Proper losing by the odd goal in three at the Racecourse Ground. In September 2014 Martin Rowe resigned and his assistant Wayne Thornhill was appointed as first team manager at the end of October.

Wayne, along with his assistants Jamie Barrett and Russell Peel. turned the season around and they finished in a creditable fifth place making the play-offs where they met Leek Town at Harrison Park who narrowly beat the Moatmen by a single goal. An appearance in the Derbyshire Senior Cup Final at the home of Chesterfield FC ended with Gresley as runners-up losing to Evo-Stik Premier side Matlock Town. At the beginning of September Wayne stepped down and Dave Langston appointed as caretaker manager. In October Scott Goodwin was appointed as manager with Jamie Barrett and Gary Rickets as his assistants. After a disappointing run of defeats Scott was released and Gary Ricketts appointed as player/manager assisted by Jamie Barrett and Dave Langston. The 2015-2016 ended with Gresley in a disappointing 16th position. Ricketts stood down as manager and former Leicester Nirvana

manager Damion Beckford-Quailey appointed in the close season. Damion's first season started well but the loss of three key players around Christmas time saw his side struggle for the rest of the campaign finishing in 18th position.

His second season 2017-2018 was not much better but it ended in a disappointing manner when the manager, management team and most of the players left the club with just four games remaining and the danger of being relegated. Former Moat boss Gary Norton stepped in to steer the club to the end of a trying season and using a mixture of reserve and youth team players managed to keep the club in step 4 finishing 17th. Norton agreed to take on the role of manager for season 2018-2019 and along with assistant Carl Slater and player/ coach Jamie Barrett have started to rebuild a side that hopefully be more competitive than the last two seasons

Early in January 2019 Norton stood down and Gavin Hurren was appointed as manager. Unfortunately, at the end of the season, Gresley were relegated from the Evo-Stik East to the Midland League. Hurren left early in the new season to be replaced by David McDermott. Gresley's results failed to improve and in February McDermott was relieved of his position. Former manager Gary Norton again stepped in to steer the ship until the end of the season.

Gresley Rovers Return

During the summer of 2020, the Gresley FC board met to discuss the possibility of re-naming the club and a unanimous decision

saw the Gresley Rovers name return to non-league football. Joint managers of Carl Abbott, Gary Norton and assistant manager Paul Thomlinson had the job of recruiting their players after the previous season was curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic and non-league football allowed to start again.

After a stop/start end of season the FA completed their reorganisation of non-league football and Rovers were placed in the new United Counties North Division under the leadership of Carl Abbott

2021-2022 proved to be a successful season finishing runners-up in the United Counties league but gained promotion due to points-per-game and are now members of the Northern Premier League Midland Division for 2022-2023

A difficult first season back at step 4 ended with Rovers gaining the points to enable them to keep our place in the Northern Premier League Midland Division for another season.

2023-2024 was a deeply disappointing season for Rovers. A poor start saw manager Carl Abbott relieved of his duties in October and Marc Strzyzewski appointed but things did not improve and after a relegation position for most of the remaining season and relegation to Step 5 saw Strzyzewski also let go during the close season.

Carl Abbott returned as manager for the new season
